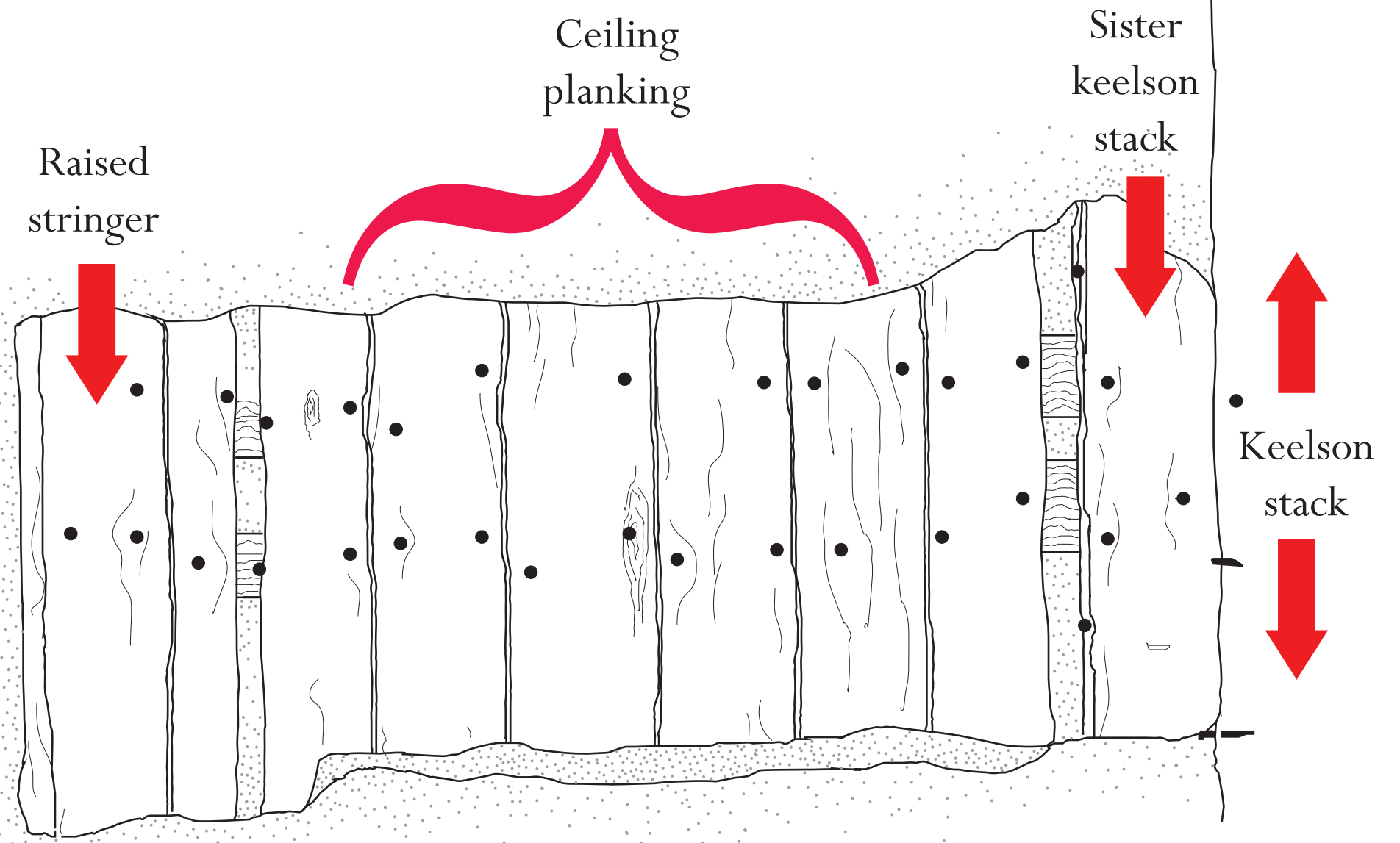

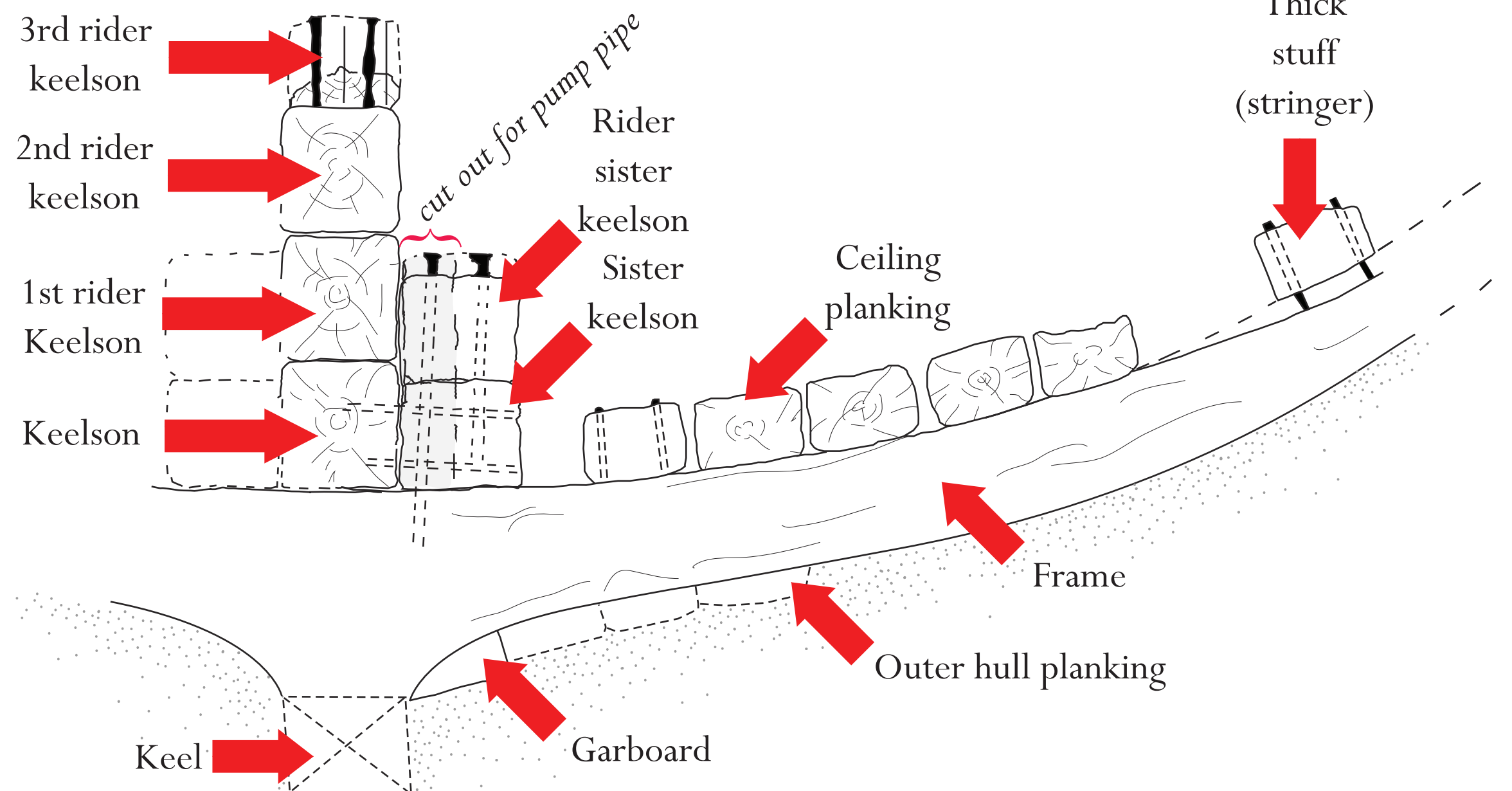
Layout of Trenches



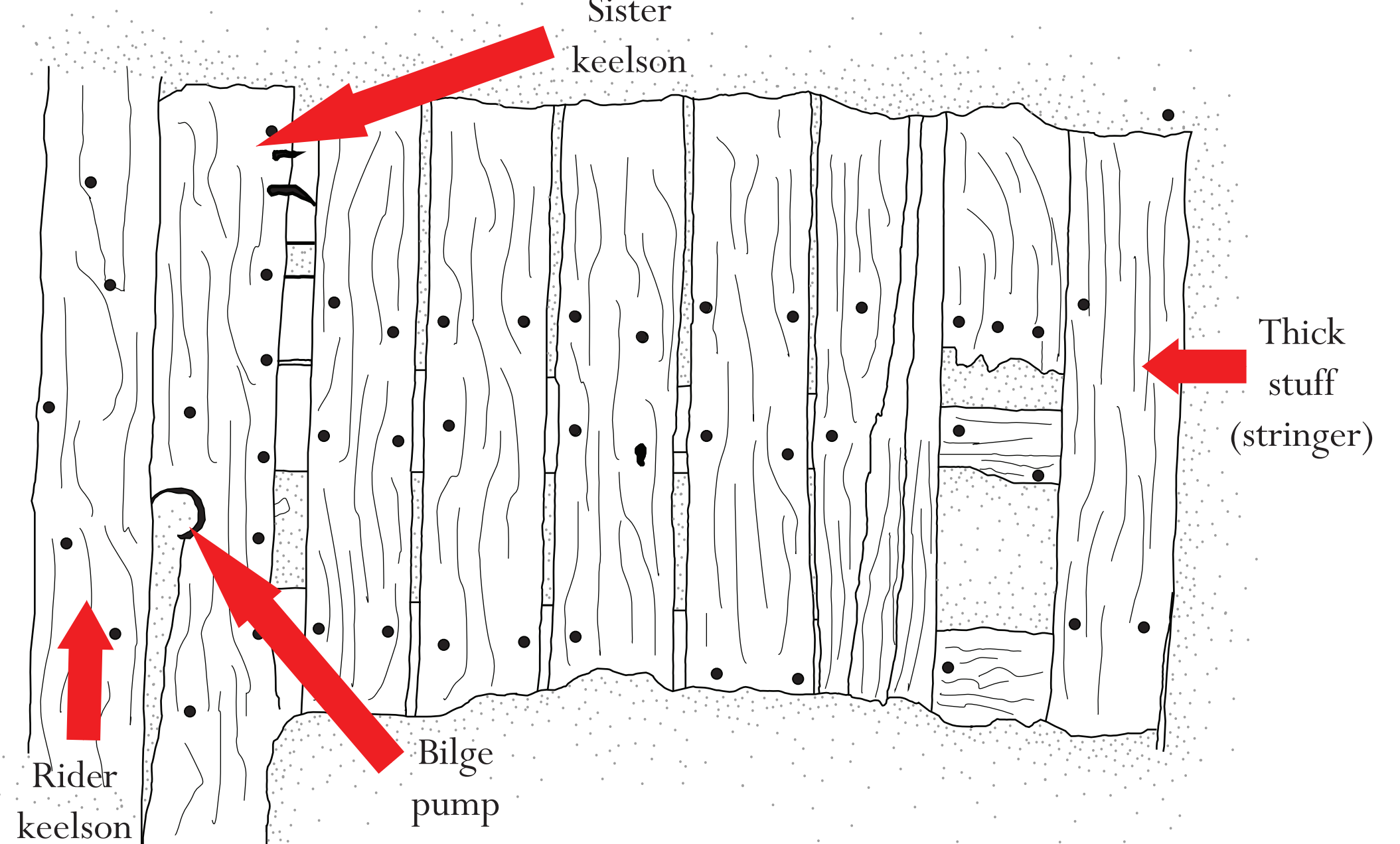
Trench 1: Plan view



Trench 2: Cross-section

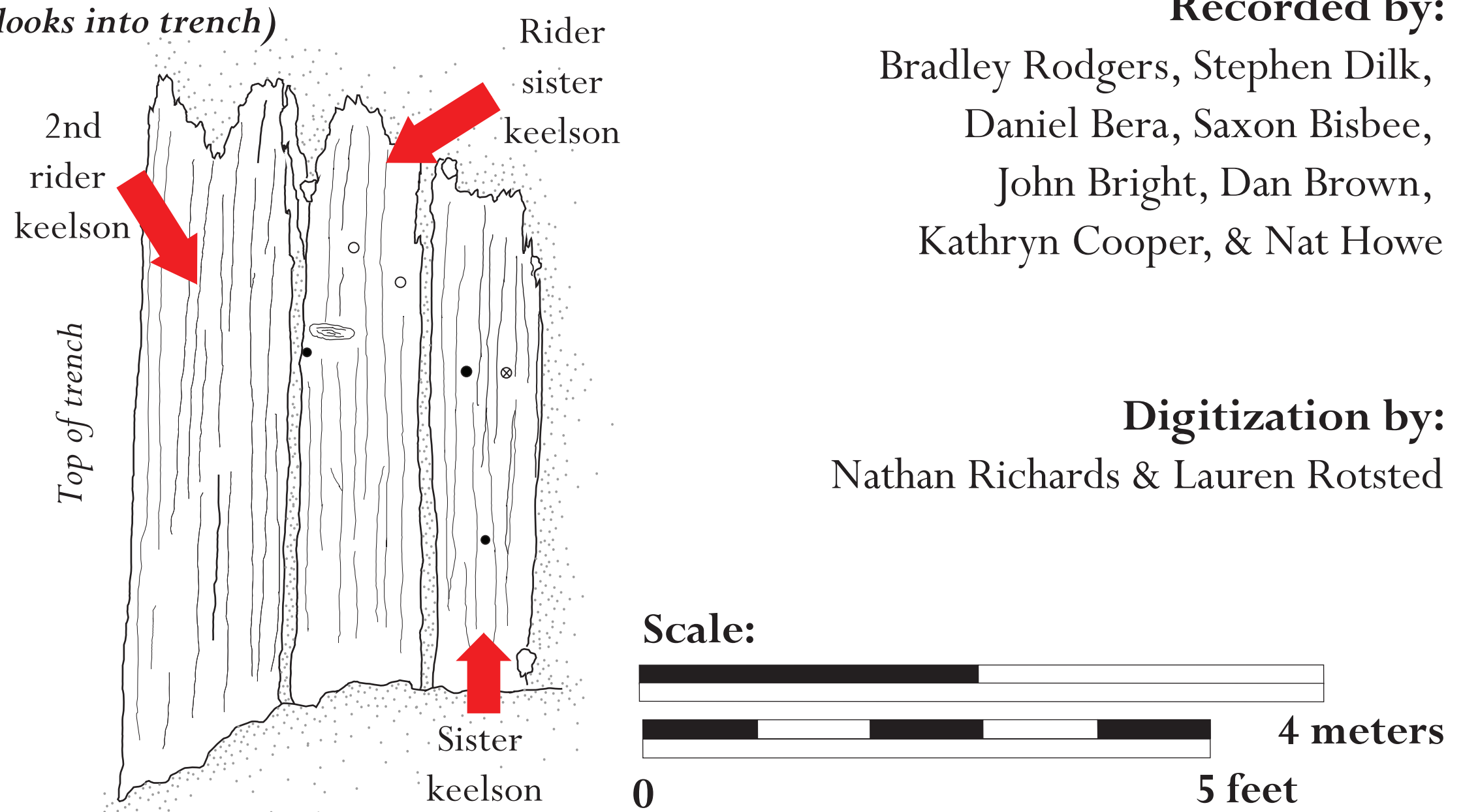


Trench 2: Plan view



Trench 2: Profile

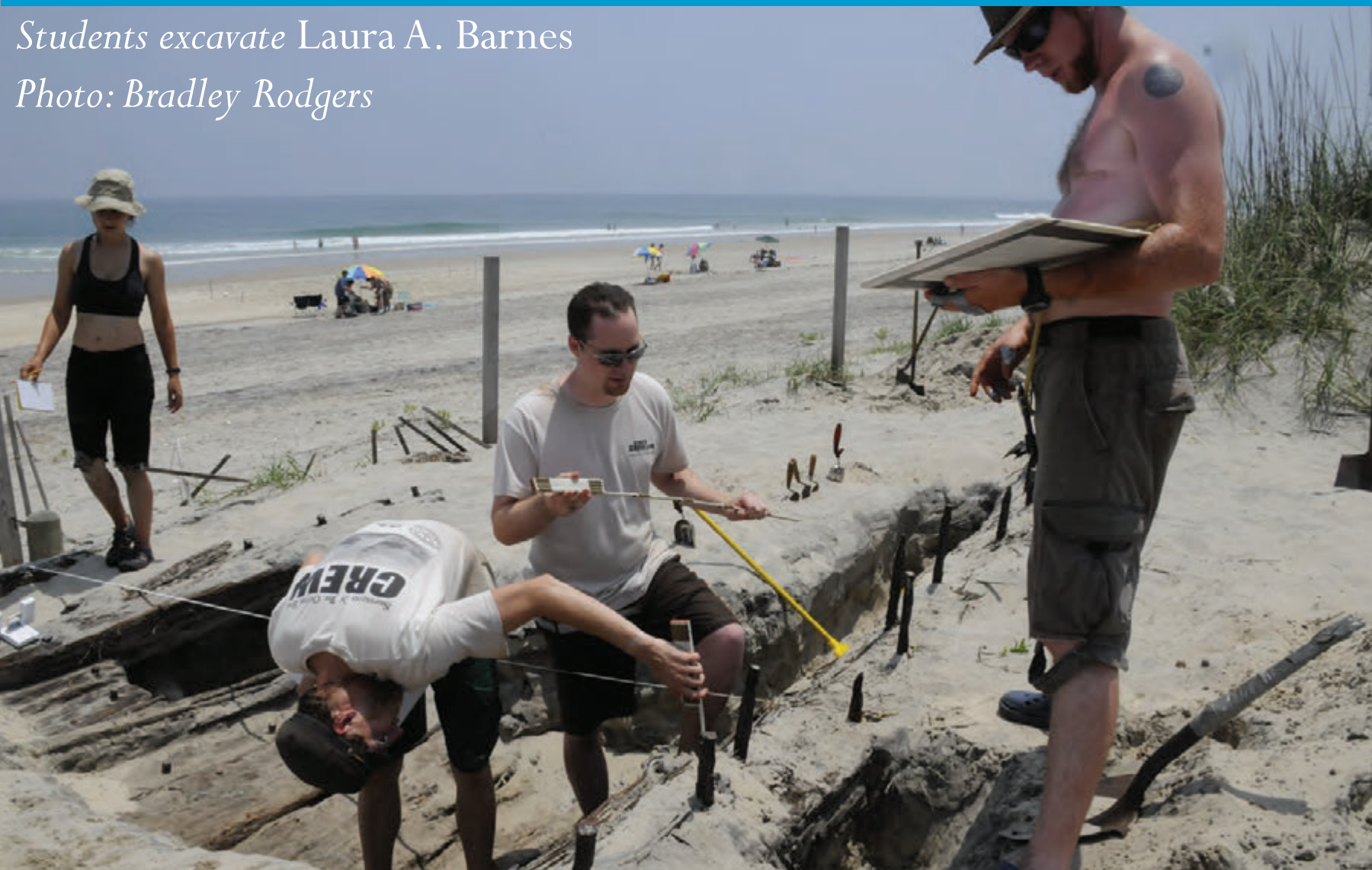
